

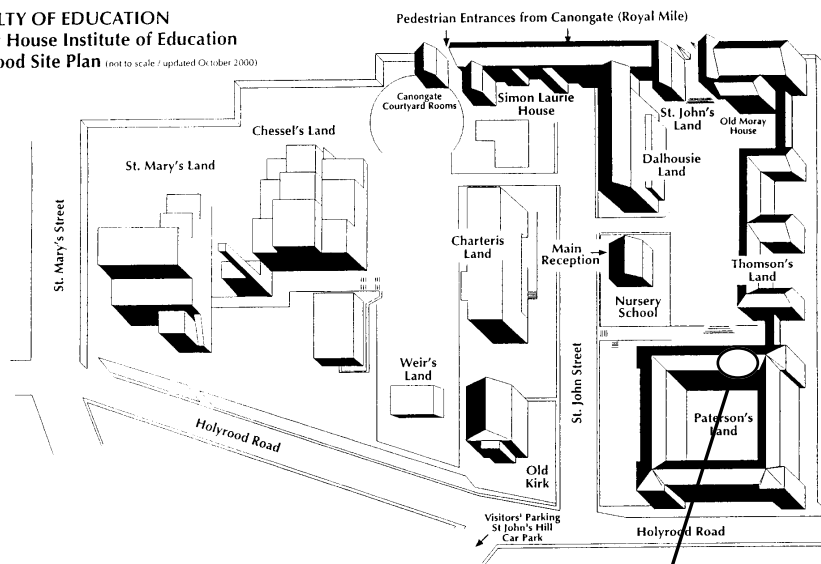
From the North (Forth Road Bridge):

On the Queensferry Road, follow the signs for the City Centre. Look out for the Holiday Inn Garden Court Hotel on the right (sort of above an Esso petrol station) at a rather complex junction.

- ❑ Go straight through these lights but prepare to turn right.
- ❑ Turn right at the next 'mini roundabout', up Belford Road and keep going straight through the next lights.
- ❑ Go down a hill past the Gallery of Modern Art and the Hilton Inn on the right.
- ❑ The road bends sharp right, you go right up a hill (Palmerston Place).
- ❑ Straight through all traffic lights (2 or 3 sets) into Torphichen Street, and another sharp right and up a hill.
- ❑ Turn left at the top (Morrison Street) past the big new Conference Centre on the left. Middle lane, go straight over the next junction into Bread Street.
- ❑ Keep going straight on (West Port, Grassmarket); you'll see the castle up on your left; then you'll go through a deep narrow road with steep buildings on both sides (Cowgate).
- ❑ Just after a big church on the left, at traffic lights (St. Mary's Street), go straight across into Holyrood Road and immediately turn right into St. John's Car Park.

CALL Centre

Getting to the CALL Centre



**CALL Centre, University of Edinburgh, Moray House,

CALL is in the building called Paterson's Land. There is disabled parking and lift access. Go up to the top floor and turn left, following signs for SSC/CALL. The Centre and meeting rooms are on one level with full wheelchair access/ toilet etc.

Plane:

Cheap flights from Luton (EasiJet); City Airport (ScotAir); Stansted (Go!) More expensive - BA and British Midland fly from Heathrow, and Gatwick. Book early for a cheaper ticket.

Airport: You could take a taxi the whole way from the airport to CALL Centre (approx £15)

Bus The Airport bus is just as fast, and is much cheaper (unless you are a group).

Come out of Edinburgh Airport and turn left along to the bus/ taxi stances. There should be an Airport bus (X100) sitting there (or there will be one just coming). Don't get a return ticket, even though it's cheaper (there are different companies operating the buses and you can't use the ticket from one company on the bus of the other!). Stay on the bus to its terminus at Waverley Bridge in the city centre.

Train:

Get out at Waverley Station and walk up the ramp where the cars go out, on to the street, Waverley Bridge. Plane and train travellers are now standing on opposite sides of the same road, the Waverley Bridge. From there, you have 2 choices:

Walking: It takes about 10 minutes (see inside). If the weather is OK, this is probably the best way unless you are heavily laden down. It's OK for wheelchairs if you are accompanied, but might be a bit hairy if not - bit hilly, lots of traffic and a slight lack of pavement ramps and pedestrian crossings.

Taxi: Taxis are right outside the station/opposite the Airport bus stop. It will take about 5 minutes to the CALL Centre (depending on traffic). Ask the driver for "Moray House" in St. Johns Street, off Holyrood Road" (Taxi drivers will NOT know how to find "CALL Centre" or "Paterson's Land").

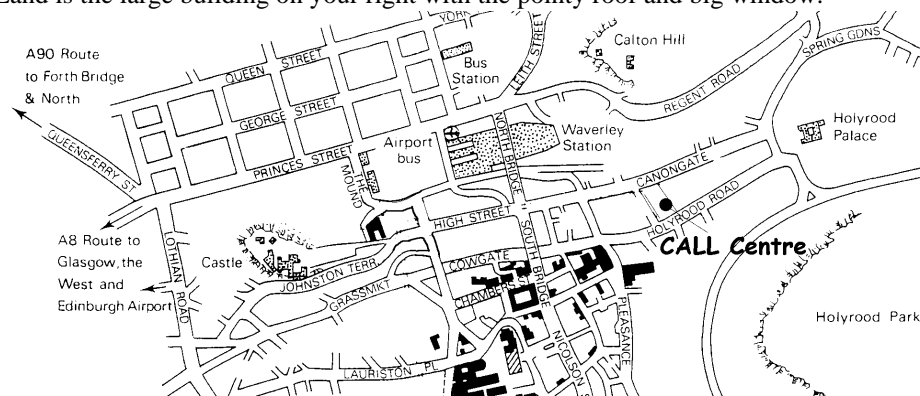
Get dropped off inside the main quad of Moray House. Paterson's Land is the large building with the pointed front roof, on your right as you stand with your back to the gate, facing into the quad.

Walking or Wheeling to the CALL Centre

By foot / wheelchair from Waverley Station and/or Airport Bus Stop

Crossing the road if necessary, stand on the same side of the road as the station, with your back to the station. Turn left (away from Princes Street) and go along to the mini roundabout. Turn left along Market Street, cross to right side of road past the City Art Gallery, then branch right into Jeffrey Street, which curves around to the right.

At the traffic lights at the far end of Jeffrey Street, cross the road (to Ragamuffin knitwear shop) and turn left, going downhill down the Canongate. Pass the Canon's Gait pub and Heraldic Design Centre. A little further on, turn right through an archway, St John's Pend. Unfortunately, this is not well-signposted, but it is directly opposite the Fresco takeaway, and leads directly into St. John's Street. Go down the left hand side of St. Johns Street past a modern (ish) block. Go through the big open gateway and down the short drive into the main quadrangle of the Moray House site. Paterson's Land is the large building on your right with the pointy roof and big window.



Car Parking

There is a car park at St. John's Hill, Holyrood Road which is just near the traffic lights at the top of Holyrood Road (signposted) on the corner with the Cowgate, the Pleasance and St. Mary's Street.

Walk down Holyrood Road, cross and turn left into St. Johns Street, then first right into the big gateway and down the short drive into the main quadrangle of the Moray House site. Paterson's Land is the large building on your right with the pointy roof and big window.

Disabled drivers can park in two marked disabled parking spaces at the front door of Paterson's Land, inside the main Moray House quad.

Getting to CALL by Car

Routes

From the West (M8, M6 / M74-A74 / A701 or A702)

Head for the City Centre, turn right at the West End (at Caledonian Hotel & St. John's church, up Lothian Road). Turn first left down Kings Stables Road, to the Grassmarket, left along the Cowgate, straight over the traffic lights into Holyrood Road.

OR

Take the City ByPass (south) A720, travelling West to East, following the signs for *A1, Berwick on Tweed*, all the way round (ignoring several junction slip roads), to the big Sheriffhall Roundabout.

From the East (A1)

Take the City ByPass A720, travelling East to West following the signs for *Forth Road Bridge, Stirling, Glasgow, Airport etc.* for one section only - to the Sheriffhall Roundabout.

From the South (A68, A7)

Follow your roads past/through Dalkeith until they both converge with the A720 at the big Sheriffhall Roundabout.

All at the Sheriffhall Roundabout

At the big Sheriffhall Roundabout, whichever road you come in on, take the exit marked A7 North (signposted *City Centre, Edinburgh South, Danderhall*). Keep going straight in towards the City Centre to a big roundabout. Go under a railway bridge on the roundabout and take the third exit, staying on A7 (marked *City Centre, St. Leonards, Old Town*) up the Dalkeith Road. You will have the big green hill (Arthur's Seat) on your immediate right; pass The Craggs pub on the left and the Royal Commonwealth Pool on your right; keep going straight on through traffic lights. The road turns into 'St. Leonards Street'. Go straight on down a steep hill, "The Pleasance", turn right at the traffic lights at the bottom. You are then in Holyrood Road.
